Urgent notice on consular services under post Covid-19 health and safety measures

Considering the health, safety and well-being of our valued consular service seekers under the health risks of highly contagious and infectious COVID-19 pandemic and to lessen inconvenience of service seekers, Bangladesh High Commission London would be undertaking the following interim measures to provide consular services until further notice.

All consular service seekers are encouraged to continue to use trackable POSTAL SERVICE for MRP re-issue, VISA, NVR, and general Attestation of documents attested by FCO and similar services. For postal services, they are encouraged to fill up online forms for NVR and VISA and post the completed print copy of the application with necessary documents.

Those consular service seekers wishing to avail consular services in person at the High Commission must secure online appointment using the following links at the High Commission website:
